Church Projects Update

With Mass having been moved into the gymnasium and the scaffolding completed in the church, there have been a number of questions about the progress and timeline of our church projects. Therefore, I thought it would be a good idea to give a bit of an update.

The Basement

The basement is still moving forward quite well. Although we do not have a definite date of its completion, I can say that it will be relatively soon. I think everyone will be quite pleased with the final product.

Church Lighting

With scaffolding up in the church, the next step is to upgrade the lighting. We will be replacing all the lighting with LED lighting. In addition, we will be adding some canned lighting and pendant lighting that will not only help with the look of the church, but will also make the space brighter for the parishioners. This portion of the church projects is quite detailed, and will take approximately 3 months to complete.

Church Painting

Although the painting company (Conrad Schmitt Studios) will be on site beginning in April, this will dominantly be to do some preliminary work (mostly on the added beams and items that will have an affect on the lighting). The real painting work will not be able to begin until after the lighting is completed (about 3 months). Once the painting begins, it will take approximately another 4 months to complete (estimating the end to be around September).

Stained-Glass Windows

The Stained-Glass Windows will be installed sometime after the lighting is upgraded. The lighting needs to be completed first, as this work may cause extra dust/dirt in the church. It is ideal that the dust/dirt be cleaned around the windows prior to the stained-glass being installed. We can look forward to this happening sometime after July/August.

Speakers

The speakers, once ordered, only take about a month and a half to be built and installed. Yet, we will not be able to order them until after the painting begins. This is because the speakers will be painted in a color that matches the wall. We will need the painters to begin painting so that we can get the exact color to match the speakers prior to ordering. Still, with it only taking a month and a half for them to be installed, this should not be a problem. Once the painting is completed, and the scaffolding is removed, we will need the speakers to be "tuned." This means that a professional will come and adjust the speakers and sound to match our space, allowing for the best sound possible.

This is all the information I have at the moment. We will continue to update everyone via the bulletin, website, Facebook, and other forms of communication as everything moves forward. As always, we thank you for your prayers and support of our church projects!

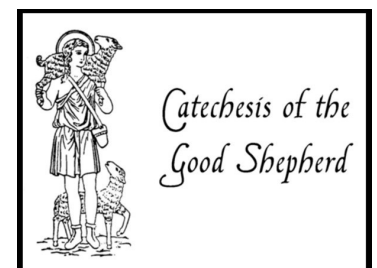

Catechesis of the Good Shephard

Now that we have presented the various places in the City of Jerusalem, one particular place we focus on with the children is the Cenacle, or the Upper Room. As we well know, the Last Supper is foundational to the Paschal Mystery, to the mystery of Christ Himself, as well as to the mystery of the Eucharistic presence. Therefore, because it is among the greatest mysteries of our faith, it should be offered to young children. Yet, the question is how? How do we remain at the level of essentiality with children as young as three? Again, we follow the rule of beginning with only the most essential announcement and allowing the truth to expand as the child grows.

Sofia Cavalletti, a founding catechist of the CGS method, writes: Initially, our focus is simply on this particular moment in Jesus' life, just before he died and rose. What did he do? What did he say in that upstairs room in the Cenacle? We introduce the reading of the text by acknowledging the liturgical time of Lent that we are in, preparing to celebrate the greatest feast when Jesus died and was risen. Just before that happened, Jesus had come once again to Jerusalem. It was the Jewish feast of Passover, which included a special meal with one's family. Jesus wanted to celebrate that feast with those most like family to him: his disciples, and so he chose a special place and sent two of his disciples there to get things ready for the Passover meal.

The materials are a wooden box representing the Cenacle, a long wooden table covered by a white cloth, three-dimensional figures of Jesus and 12 apostles, a small paten holding a clay model of bread, and a small chalice. Each item is put in place slowly at the right time in the narrative. Great emphasis is placed on Jesus' simple words: "Take and eat. This is my body." "Take and drink. This is my blood."
