Second Sunday of Lent - Sunday, February 25, 2024



Dear Loving Parishioners,

I hope and believe that having known the four steps for the active preparation for Easter, you have begun to identify your sins and their roots and started to do some acts of penance which would purify you to be a practicing Christian starting from the first week of the Lent. What shall we do in the second week of Lent?

If you have analyzed your hearts and found out your sins, let us go further to find out the pragmatic meaning and the benefits of the fast basing on the book of Prophet Isaiah. "This is the fast that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke, sharing bread, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, and not turning your back to your own, etc. (Isa 58:6-9). All these imperatives express our social commitment to a believing and righteous community. Without doing these things and seeing in others the image of suffering Christ, mere prayer, fast and penance would not bring the closeness of God in our lives.

Our Lenten preparation has a dual dimension personal and communitarian. Personal dimension restricts doings (of our wishes) and communitarian exhorts doings (the wishes of others). Prophet Isaiah does not fail to say the benefits of pragmatic fast: "Your wound shall quickly be healed, and the glory of the Lord shall be your real guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer." (Isa 58:8).

In the second week of Lent, let us focus our attention on our community: setting our life as an example to our fellow brethren, showing our social commitment and bringing the attention of our Lord by doing meaningful fasting by doing his will. Then we may see his closeness in our preparation, for Prophet Isaiah says that you shall cry for help, and He (the Lord) will say Here I am. (Isa 58:9b).

May we start our fasting by reading the Word of God, feeding the hungry, heeding the cry for justice, taking the cross daily, choosing the narrow path but widening our hands for help, fixing our eyes on Calvary and reaching it out with Jesus. Our sacraments and sacramentals help us on our inner and outer journey to radiate God in our day today life. Let us walk together with faith and hope with our Lord Jesus towards our destiny. - Fr. Trinity Savariyar

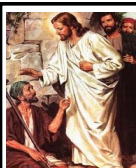

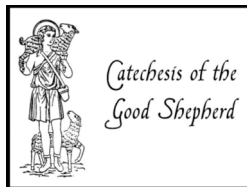

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

We began a new liturgical season on Ash Wednesday: Lent! Lent is a time of preparation for the greatest feast of Easter. Again, in the atrium, the prayer table is changed to reflect this time of preparation. We use a purple cloth to cover the prayer table and adorn the table with things that will help us to focus on Lent. For us adults, we know Lent is a means for making a sacrifice by giving something up, but for our 3–6-year-old children, it is harder to process. As they grow older, it becomes easier to understand.

To help understand this meaning in the atrium, our children will hear the parable of the Good Shepherd. The parable of the Good Shepherd helps us focus on a deep meaning of laying down one's life. With our early readings and shared reflections with young children we omit the verses that pertain to evil and the wolf (which are reflected on later as the child grows older and becomes more aware of good and bad) and focus on the ordinary ways the Good Shepherd shows extraordinary love every day. First, by knowing each sheep so well, he calls them each by name and leads them out. He goes ahead of them and the sheep follow because they know his voice. There's a real intimacy here that we can relate to in our family life. We love to be together and our ears are especially attuned to hear the voices of those we most love. Together we can focus on listening more closely to the voice of the Good Shepherd during Lent and carry that habit of close listening into the Easter season. If a child becomes distressed over the death of Jesus, we return to this parable where Jesus says He gives His life, it's not taken from Him. We also remember together that Jesus is risen! (cgsusa.org) *Here are some passages you might like to read with your family relating to the Good Shepherd: John 10:3b-5, 10b-11, 14-16; Luke 15:4-6; Psalm 23:1*
