Our Lenten Penance

The season of Lent is upon us. During the season of Lent, it is common that we either give up or take on some sort of practice or penance. This is meant to help us overcome our vices, grow in virtue, and improve our spiritual lives as a whole. Therefore, as we consider our penitential practices this Lent, I thought it might be helpful to offer a bit of a reflection/guide in our discernment so as to more fully benefit from whatever we choose to do. This guide involves a 4-step process.

Step 1: Choose one of the deadly sins in which you struggle with the most.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church names 7 deadly sins, also known as capital sins (CCC 1866). These sins are pride, anger (wrath), lust, gluttony, sloth, greed (avarice), and envy. To be able to name which one of these sins is most prominent in our life can give us great direction in how exactly we wish to give up sin and grow in holiness.

Step 2: Know the source of temptation of our sin.

Traditionally, there are 3 sources of temptation: the world, the flesh, and the devil. It is important to know which of these sources is the root of our sin. Generally, the sins of envy and greed have been associated with temptations of the world. The sins of sloth, gluttony, and lust usually stem from temptations of the flesh. The sins of anger and pride have historically been said to be rooted in temptations from the devil.

Step 3: Know how the sources of temptation relate to the 3 forms of atonement/penance.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church recalls 3 forms of penance/atonement for sin. These 3 forms are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (CCC 1434). These can also be found in Scripture, in Matthew 6:1-18, and Tobit 12:8. Each of these forms of penance can be quite helpful in combatting particular sins and temptations. To counter temptations of the world, almsgiving is helpful. Normally we think of almsgiving as some form of monetary donation; however, this can also be done simply by going through one's home and finding other items, such as food, clothes, or even other objects that might benefit another more than ourselves, and donating them to a local organization. To deny temptations of the flesh, fasting is a good practice. This is often done through giving up a certain food, beverage, or even snacks between meals or meals themselves. In denying temptations from the devil, it is important to rely on prayer. There are many prayers, chaplets, litanies, novenas, and other devotions in the Catholic Church. Simple reading of Scripture or other spiritual writing can be quite fruitful as well.

Step 4: Choose which penance is most beneficial for you.

Now we can put this all together. Once a person is able to name his/her primary vice, one can then discern the source of temptation of that vice, and through this, know which form of penance will be best (see chart below). It should be noted that this reflection is based on general norms; they are not necessarily applicable in every situation. Nonetheless, if we can be intentional in the way we enter into our Lenten practices and penances, hopefully this can have a great and long-lasting effect on our spiritual lives.

I would encourage you to spend some time in prayer and discernment as to how we wish to enter into this upcoming season. With this, may we all have a very fruitful and blessed Lent!



Catechesis of the Good Shephard

We began a new liturgical season on Ash Wednesday: Lent! Lent is a time of preparation for the greatest feast of Easter. Again, in the atrium, the prayer table is changed to reflect this time of preparation. We use a purple cloth to cover the prayer table and adorn the table with things that will help us to focus on Lent. For us adults, we know Lent is a means for making a sacrifice by giving something up, but for our 3–6-year-old children, it is harder to process. As they grow older, it becomes easier to understand.



To help understand this meaning in the atrium, our children will hear the parable of the Good Shepherd. The parable of the Good Shepherd helps us focus on a deep meaning of laying down one's life. With our early readings and shared reflections with young children we omit the verses that pertain to evil and the wolf (which are reflected on later as the child grows older and becomes more aware of good and bad) and focus on the ordinary ways the Good Shepherd shows extraordinary love every day. First, by knowing each sheep so well, he calls them each by name and leads them out. He goes ahead of them and the sheep follow because they know his voice. There's a real intimacy here that we can relate to in our family life. We love to be together and our ears are especially attuned to hear the voices of those we most love. Together we can focus on listening more closely to the voice of the Good Shepherd during Lent and carry that habit of close listening into the Easter season. If a child becomes distressed over the death of Jesus, we return to this parable where Jesus says He gives His life, it's not taken from Him. We also remember together that Jesus is risen! (cgsusa.org) *Here are some passages you might like to read with your family relating to the Good Shepherd: John 10:3b-5, 10b-11, 14-16; Luke 15:4-6; Psalm 23:1*
