Reclaiming the Lord's Day - Reclaiming the Mass Part 3: The Giving

Last week, in "Part 2" of this series on reclaiming the Mass, we established that the primary purpose of the Mass, and hence our primary motivation, is not about what we get out of it, but rather it is to give praise and thanks to God. Although this sounds good, it is still rather vague. How do we do this? What does it look like? Our goal this week will be to attempt to more fully answer these questions.

Preliminary Understanding – The Liturgy

To begin, it is helpful to have a better understanding of the word "Liturgy." This word originates in Greek, and is actually composed of 2 Greek words – *Leit*, meaning "people," and *ergon*, meaning "work." Therefore, a literal definition of the word "Liturgy" is "the work of the people."

At the same time, we must remember that in reality, the Mass is God's work, not ours. With this in mind, we can give an even better understanding of the word "Liturgy." It is "the work of God on behalf of the people."

Liturgy of the Mass, liturgy of our Lives

Having established a working definition for the Liturgy, I would like to offer a meditation on the difference between *Liturgy* (with a capital "L") and *liturgy* (with a lowercase "l"). In this context, the Liturgy (capital "L") refers to the rites and rubrics of the Mass, as well as other proper celebrations of the Church. It is in these rites that we are participating in the work of God, offering ourselves in praise and thanksgiving to the Lord.

Now, an essential part of our understanding of the Liturgy of the Mass is that the Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1324). This means that, as the source, our entire lives should flow from the Eucharist and our celebration of it, and as the summit, our entire lives should flow back to the Eucharist. Why do we say this? Because the Eucharist is Christ Himself – His true presence, body, blood, soul, and divinity! Our entire lives flow from Christ, and should return to Christ.

With this in mind, we now move to an understanding of the *liturgy* (lowercase "l"). This has also been called "the liturgy of our lives." Basically, we are not just called to participate in the work of the Lord for an hour during Mass on Sunday; we are called to participate in His saving work *every day*. And we do this in *every way*! We set aside ample time every day for prayer and devotion. We strive to grow in knowledge and understanding of our faith. We seek opportunities to make sacrifices and perform works of mercy for those we encounter. Even our roles as mothers, fathers, children, friends, our careers, our hobbies, etc., when given their proper place in life and lived according to God's desires can be seen as part of the work of God in the world.

Putting It All Together – The Giving

Now we will combine all these concepts. The purpose of the Mass is to give praise and thanks to God. What exactly are we to give? We give the *liturgy of our lives*! Throughout the week, as Christians, we should be gathering the works of God – our prayers, penances, works, and all that is part of God's work in the world. We collect these works, and when we come to Mass, we recall them so as to offer them to God in the Liturgy of the Mass.

Then, after encountering Christ in the Liturgy of the Mass, hopefully we will also be given the grace to bring Christ once again into the world. This is one of the ways to understand how the Eucharist is truly the source and summit of our faith; the Liturgy of the Mass and the liturgy of our lives feed one another in an everlasting cycle, allowing us to always participate more fully in the work of the Lord.

Final Image

I would like to offer one final image – a baseball team. Let's say there is a team that is in a league that only plays one day a week. If the team shows up to the game, but never practices, what affect will that have on the team? Will the team be successful? And if not, will the game even be any fun? This is why the liturgy of our lives is so important to the Liturgy of the Mass. It has been said, if we aren't good at participating in the work of God in our daily lives, how can we expect to be good at truly entering into the Liturgy of the Mass on Sunday? Let us make sure we constantly strive to grow in our faith so that in all things we may partake in the work of God and offer our entire lives in praise and thanksgiving to the Lord.

Dear Parents,

As you know, the Diocese of Salina will be moving to the Restored Order of the Sacraments. As Bishop Jerry Vincke announced in August 2025, “The restored order is having Baptism first, followed by the Sacrament of Confirmation, and then the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This is how the Church designed it. These three Sacraments are the Initiation Sacraments, with the Eucharist being the final Sacrament as we enter fully into the Church.”

What does this look like for Immaculate Heart of Mary, St. Joseph, and St. Nicholas of Myra parishes? In short, with the blessing of our respective priests, we will be implementing this process in one year and it will affect the students entering grades 2-8 in the 2026-2027 school year.

- Students entering 2nd grade will only receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation this year.
- Because the Diocese’s Restored Order process calls for the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist to be received in 3rd grade, there will not be First Communion (other than for those going through the Order of Christian Initiation for Children/Adults process as a family) in our respective parishes during the 2026-2027 school year.
- Students entering grades 3-8 will prepare for and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

As we look forward to the 2027-2028 school year and beyond:

- Our 2nd-grade students will continue to only receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Our 3rd-grade students will receive both Confirmation and First Eucharist in the same Mass.

We understand there are a lot of questions surrounding this move. This letter is simply the first of several messages we’ll be sending out to you in preparation for the coming school year and all that the Restored Order process entails. Further details, answers to questions, etc. will be addressed in those future communications. For now, we ask that you please scan the QR code below and read through the documents from the diocese.



We look forward to partnering with you, the first educators of your children in the faith, in this process!
