Reclaiming the Lord's Day - Reclaiming the Mass
Part 5: A Day of Rest???

The Day of Rest – Origins and Problems Entailed

The Lord's Day has always been understood as being a day of rest. This is Scripturally based, as we see from the story of creation that God rested on the 7th day (Gn 2:2-3), as well as it being prescribed that no work should be done on the Sabbath as part of the 10 Commandments (Ex 20:8-10). This not only means that we are to refrain from work, but we are to refrain from activities that would require others to work as well.

However, the more we look into this, the more we will see it as being somewhat problematic for many reasons. First, there are some occupations that are still necessary, even on the Lord's Day (for example, those in the medical field, first responders, and even clergy). Along with that, in our busy and hectic world, sometimes Sunday is the only day for some people to complete various projects around the home. And what about work that people enjoy, like gardening, crafts, hobbies, and the like?

We will also see problems with the strict "no work" teachings within the Scriptures and theology itself. Jesus allowed work to be done on the Sabbath when He permitted His disciples to pick grain for food (Mt 12:1-8), and when He healed the man with the withered hand (Mt 12:9-14). Along with that, have you ever wondered, does God Himself really rest on the Lord's Day? And what would be the result if He did? If God truly rested from all work on Sunday, in essence that would mean He would not answer prayers on Sundays, God would not dispense His grace and mercy on Sundays, He would no longer work to hold the world in being on Sundays, and the ultimate result would be the obliteration of all existence!

The "no work" policy also seems to be in conflict with the very nature of the Mass. First of all, because in previous articles, we have discussed how the Liturgy is defined as "the work of the people," or better understood as "the work of God on behalf of the people." This isn't to mention the very experience of many families as they strive to get to Mass. Parents have to wake up early, get the kids out of bed, make breakfast (soon enough to adhere to the fast prior to Communion), get everyone dressed, inevitably step in to fix arguments of whose turn it is to use the bathroom, find the missing shoes, pile everyone in the vehicle, stress about making it on time, rush in with 2 seconds to spare, etc. To put it simply, it is work!

So, with all of this, how are we to understand the Lord's Day as a day of rest, and particularly, how to we reconcile this with the work of the Lord that is the Mass?

A Clearer Understanding

Much of this can be resolved with a clearer understanding of the notion of work on Sundays. It is not so much that no work is allowed on the Lord's Day, but rather no unnecessary work should be done on Sundays. The word "unnecessary" is what is key.

This will already solve many problems. The vital occupations for our society, the few needed jobs and projects that have to get done around the house, and even the enjoyable tasks that we need to bring us rejuvenation and joy all become legitimate. We can all be grateful as well that not even God gives up the necessary work to continue to answer prayers and grant us the grace we need in life, even on Sundays!

Work and Worship

There is a unique and special element when we apply the "only necessary work" concept to the Mass. In Hebrew, the word "Avodah," is actually the word for both "work" and "worship." This is not just coincidence, but strikes to the heart of Hebrew understanding. It is true, we are called to refrain from unnecessary work, but this does not mean we are to neglect that which is necessary. In fact, we must do that which is necessary. Even the ancient Jewish/Hebrew mindset understood the necessary connection between "work" and "worship" in their single word for both, "Avodah."

The Mass is not only necessary; it is the most absolute necessity of all the work that could possibly be done on the Lord's Day. This work is also part of fulfilling the third of the 10 Commandments. It is in the Mass, this "work of God on behalf of the people," that we work to give ourselves completely to Christ, uniting our self-gift to the passion, death, and Resurrection of our Lord, and we look forward to being completely united to the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. No other work is more necessary than that; no other work is more important.

Final Thought

It is probably true that most all of us need to grow in our ability of keeping the Lord's Day holy by refraining from unnecessary work and making it an authentic day of rest. At the same time, let us not shy away from that which is of ultimate importance, giving ourselves completely to the work of the Lord at the holy sacrifice of the Mass.

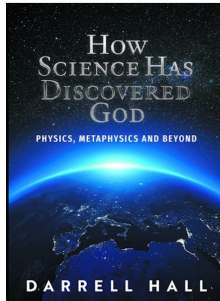
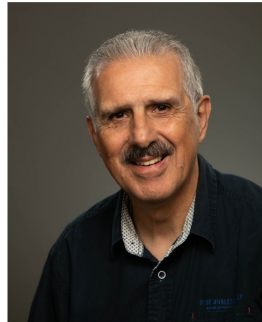
