I'll have baptized two babies, buried one person, helped with a few weddings, and followed the Hospital Chaplain around as he gave Anointings. This will be my final full weekend in the Parish. Next Week we'll have the Seminarian Fundraiser Dinners and the Eucharistic Congress. The week after that, the Seminarians will have their week-long gathering to simply rest, enjoy fraternity with each other and pray together. It's always my favorite time of the year.

I'll have one more semester of school in St Louis. In December, the Seminary will take my class to the Holy Land (if they're not blowing each other up—otherwise we'll go to Greece, Turkey and Rome, following the footsteps of St Paul the Apostle). Either option will be amazing—especially looking forward to Ephesus, where St John and Mother Mary lived.

In January I'll have my "Canonical retreat"—5 to 8 days of silent prayer to ready myself for priest ordination. Then I'll be back somewhere in the Diocese as a Deacon—not sure where yet. My ordination to the priesthood is set for June 5th, 10am at the Cathedral. Thank you again for welcoming me into your parish. Please pray for me, be assured that I'll be praying for you!

COOP Mission Appeal at Immaculate Heart of Mary - August 1 & 2

The Diocese of Lexington is a designated mission diocese, serving 50 counties, with the geographic size of Maryland, Delaware and Rhode Island combined. We minister to the urban/suburban areas in and around Lexington, KY as well as 40 of the counties in the impoverished mountain region of Appalachia. There are 39,004 Roman Catholics in our diocese, comprising just 3% of the total population of 1.5 million.

While Catholics are low in number in Eastern Kentucky, the Church is known as a source of comfort for all who are in need of spiritual renewal and physical support. The diocese faces daily challenges to provide resources and personnel to effectively offer outreach ministries to this vastly hidden population. While rich in culture, many of our Appalachian counties have been afflicted with persistent unemployment, addiction and poverty. Most recently catastrophic flooding has displaced thousands of families. Priests in the area must serve multiple parishes and often travel 35-40 miles one way over the mountains to celebrate weekend Masses. Ultimately, the Catholic presence in Appalachia would diminish without the generous response from outside assistance because these small parishes are not able to financially support themselves.

Many of our parishes in Eastern Kentucky serve as emergency assistance responders by providing rent and utility assistance, food pantries, and thrift stores. Providing this critical assistance to those in need is how we show the face of God to others. We do not serve people because they are Catholic, but we do it because WE are Catholic. These encounters provide an opportunity to share our faith and invite others on a journey with Christ.

Please remember the Catholic Diocese of Lexington in your prayers as we walk alongside those in poverty and addiction. Volunteer opportunities abound in the mission fields and financial support directly benefits the people we serve.
