Reclaiming the Lord's Day - Reclaiming the Mass Part 6: Why Not On My Own??? – Part 1

In the first article of this series, we reflected on the effect of the Covid shutdown on people's understanding, experience, and practice of Sunday Mass. During the shutdown, people stayed home, would watch a livestream or recorded video of the Mass, perhaps participated in some other prayers or devotions, and still felt as though this was sufficient to have a rejuvenating and fulfilling Lord's Day. However, once the shutdown was lifted, and Mass was once again offered on a regular basis, many of the people did not return.

Throughout this series, we have tried to clarify the proper understanding of the Mass and the importance of attending. However, there still is a very good question that needs to be addressed: Why can't people worship on their own?

Why does personal prayer and devotion, watching Mass on TV, and continuing the "Covid experience" not suffice?

A Word on Watching the Mass

First, it may be helpful to make a clarification on livestream Masses or Mass on TV. During Covid, this was very much practiced and promoted. Yet, it should be understood, watching Mass has actually *never* been an option to fulfill the Sunday obligation. This is only an encouraged practice when one has been *dispensed* of the Sunday obligation. If for a serious reason a person is not able to attend Mass (see CCC 2181), it is an excellent practice to watch Mass instead; it should only be noted that one is not fulfilling their obligation by doing this, as they are already dispensed from it.

Following the Will of God

As for a more direct answer to why worshiping on our own does not suffice to keep holy the Lord's Day – simply, it isn't what God wants! It is true, we should be sure to worship on our own. At the same time, God has always desired His people to come together for communal worship as well.

We can see the beginnings of this in the Old Testament. Of course there is the command to "Keep the Sabbath Day Holy" (Ex 20:8-11). Along with that, one can see significant communal aspects of the ancient celebrations of Passover, Pentecost (an ancient Jewish harvest festival), and the feast of Booths, not to mention the other sacrifices and regularly practiced synagogue services.

The New Testament will become even more bold and clear about the importance of communal celebration. In the Acts of the Apostles, the community of believers gathered every Lord's Day for the Eucharist (Acts 20:7), and St. Paul is clear about it in his first letter to the Corinthians (see 1 Corinthians, chapters 10-14, 16).

In essence, to worship God on Sunday on our own is like saying, "I will worship you, Lord. But I want to worship you when I want, where I want, how I want, and on my own terms." Yet, shouldn't we be worshiping God on *His* terms? Shouldn't we worship God when *He* wants, where *He* wants, and how *He* wants? Shouldn't the Lord truly be the Lord of all things, including in the way we offer Him our praise and thanksgiving? God does not desire faith and worship to be solely an individualistic thing, but He desires His people to also come together, united as one body of Christ, to worship Him in community as His Church.

More to Come

This gives us a foundation as to why we come together to worship on the Lord's Day. However, there is much more. Next week, I hope to examine the difference between giving praise and thanksgiving on our own and at the Mass. In addition, I hope to explain the grave dangers behind what modern society and modern Christianity calls "personal religion," and even its importance to our salvation.

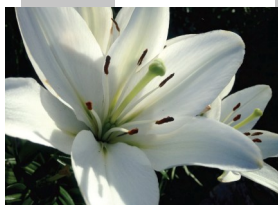
